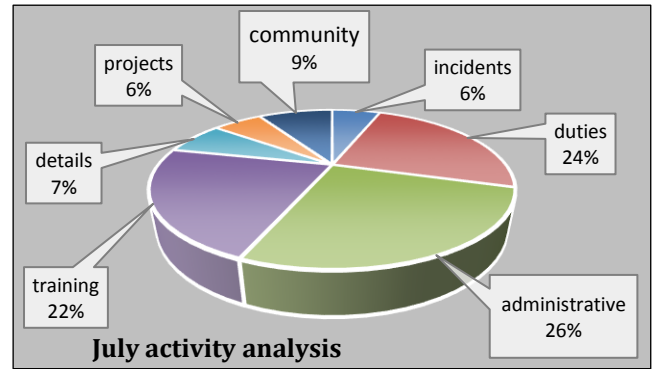

Fire/EMS Service Delivery

Incident Report (2016 total to-date incidents: 279)

JULY 2016: 35 incident calls ... 15 incident hours

- EMS – 9
- Fire – 4 (structure 2, grass/woods 1, alarm 1)
- Service – 14
- MVA – 3
- Rescue – 0
- Invalid Assist – 2
- HAZMAT – 0
- Cancellations - 3



Department Notables

Operations

- Fire hydrant static and residual flow testing (per ISO requirement) now completed. Hydrants will be greased, cleared and painted (bonnets only according to NFPA g.p.m. criteria).
- Support of summer camps ends August 5th. CHFD engaged with Cochran Mill Nature Center, Serenbe Camps, Serenbe Soccer Camp, and various church “school” programs.



- Technical issues resolved for “ground-to-air” communications with air med-evac service providers.
- Planning for training related to “Fire Attack in Multi-level Buildings” and “Active Shooter” is underway with area sister fire departments.
- Commitment maintained for three fire/EMS personnel on duty at all times.
