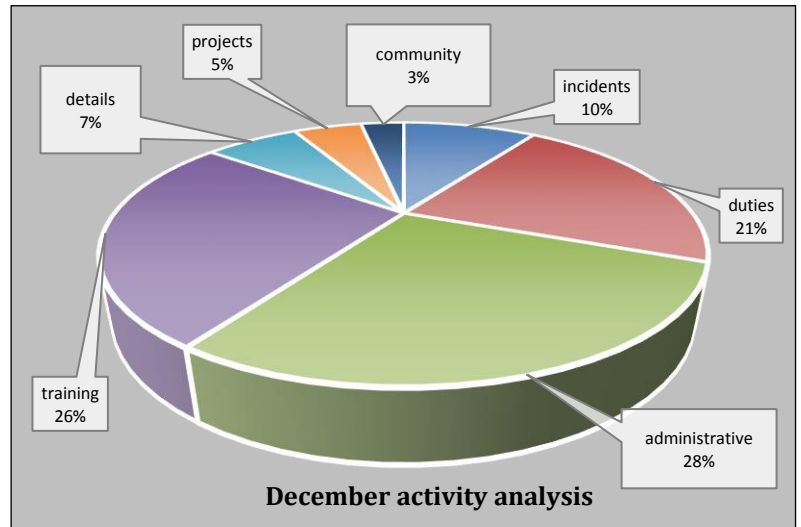

## Fire/EMS Service Delivery

### Incidents (2016 total incidents: 490)

### Training Division

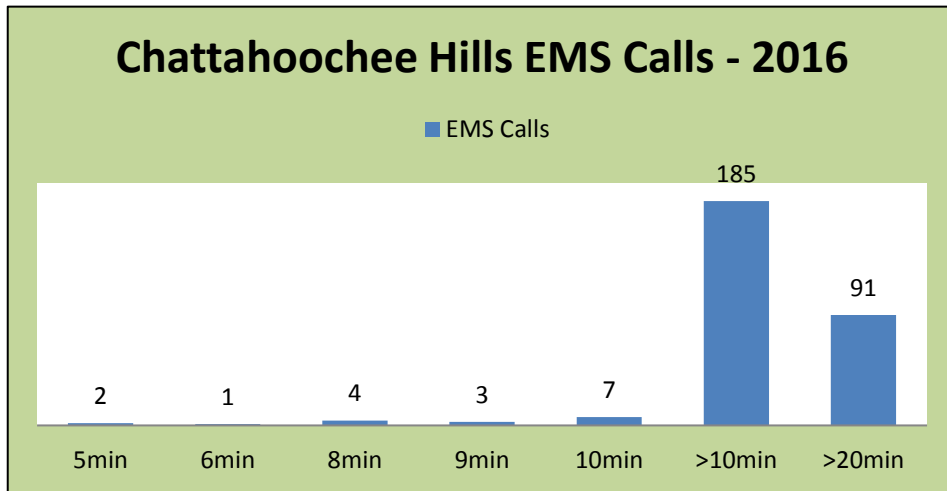

### Chief's Office

1. Fire Station 51 required several "immediate" repairs during December including replacement of some bathroom plumbing and a septic pumping system.
2. Discussions by South Fulton Fire Chiefs with American Medical Response (AMR) for improved "on scene" response times have slowed. Fire Chiefs in all municipalities disagree with terms put forward by AMR in their proposed, new service agreement. Chattahoochee Hills Fire Rescue is preparing a model for medical response (resources) that can handle "emergency" transport, when needed in "exigent" circumstances.
3. City Manager and Fire Chief collaborating to submit application for a Local Government Risk Management Services (LGRMS) for safety training and resources to serve all employees.
4. Fire Chief is preparing a draft for an ordinance to define/consolidate all "approved fire safety practices" within city boundaries.
