



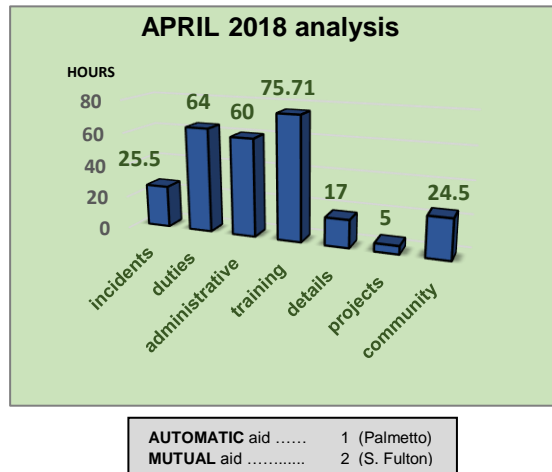

Fire Operations

- A motor vehicle collision involving three vehicles on April 24 at South Fulton Pkwy and Rivertown Rd resulted in one fatality and one patient air-lifted to a nearby trauma center. Both individuals required hydraulic extrication. All Chattahoochee Hills Fire and Police units responded with additional support from Palmetto Fire, Fairburn Police, GA State Patrol, GA Dept of Public Safety—Motor Carrier Division, GA Dept of Transportation and Rhino Services (hazardous material remediation).



- “Automatic aid” with the City of South Fulton and other south Fulton Fire/EMS departments is nearing reality. Presently, draft agreements are being reviewed by the Fire Chiefs and will be forwarded soon to the individual municipalities’ legal counsel. Automatic aid will benefit Chattahoochee Hills city-wide with regard to fire service delivery, but only northern-most residents will receive benefit towards homeowner insurance costs.

EMS Services

- Final determinations by the Georgia EMS Region 3 Council to award a new service agreement to an ambulance service for south Fulton County municipalities occurs on May 1 and May 8. Mayors and Fire Chiefs unanimously recommended Grady Healthcare System to replace American Medical Response (AMR).
- CHFD’s “Community Paramedicine” program *ChattCare* has received a preliminary approval from the department’s Medical Director, Dr. Chris Edens. Policies and protocols are being expanded towards implementing the program July 1, 2018. *ChattCare*’s program objectives are ...
 1. Identify, contact and follow-up with “at risk” patients and/or specific residents to offer assistance
 2. Provide regular monitoring of health conditions, vital signs, medication compliance and (limited) wound care
 3. Interface with physicians to help coordinate additional patient care and transport, as required
 4. Provide regular education and individual assessments in public venues

- An upcoming strategic planning/training exercise (May 11) with Walton County Fire and Sheriff departments will move Chattahoochee Hills and other south Fulton public safety departments one step closer to developing “Active Shooter” tactical plans and collateral programs such as “Stop the Bleed” (to be taught to any citizen group).
- Fire Station 51 kitchen areas are about to undergo renovation. Wall/floor cabinets and countertops will be replaced. The station kitchen has not been renovated since the Fire Station’s construction in 1982.

Chattahoochee Hills Emergency Management (CHEMA)

- Chattahoochee Hills Emergency Management will re-initiate development and training of "Citizen Emergency Response Teams" (CERT) beginning July 2018. Persons interested in CERT should contact Chief Greg Brett, greg.brett@chatthillsga.us
