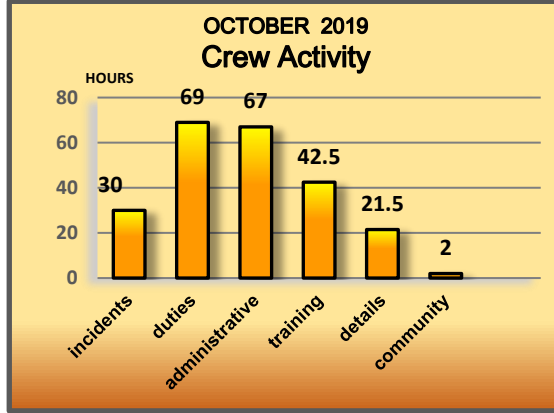

- We finally have a draft (approved by Fulton legal counsel) of the automatic-aid service agreement with the City of South Fulton. The boundary information for both cities is now being reviewed by Fulton GIS and Emergency Services departments.
- The air system leaks on the HME fire engine, our first-out unit, have finally been repaired. Additional features that allow large-volume water support with other departments have been added to the HME, also.
- Live-fire training will take place next week in Peachtree City with Palmetto and Fairburn fire departments. Coweta Station 14 personnel will be handling calls for us.
